The need

The State of Israel has 9.3 million inhabitants, and about 7 million of them live between Hadera and Gedera. By 2048, Israel's centennial year, the population is expected to be 17 million. If today's trends continue, 75% of Israeli residents will overcrowd 25% of its territory, creating insurmountable crises. The development towns of the Negev and Galilee are underdeveloped and are main centers of inequality today. The negative image and inner-city narrative prevent companies and families from relocating to cities that are struggling to progress.

The solution

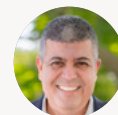
The development of two additional thriving centers in the Negev and Galilee that will become national growth engines, independent centers of life, and will serve as a magnet for all sectors looking for a better quality of life and future opportunities. By leveraging and developing growth and expansion potential in existing cities, entire regions will thrive and become independent and sustainable communities of growth.

The purpose

"Equitable Cities" is a national program that accelerates development of the peripheral cities in the Negev and Galilee. Partnered with Government ministries and authorities, this program works to reduce social gaps and poverty, increase demand for housing, encourage urban growth and quality employment; turning the city into a magnet for new residents and a source of pride for the current inhabitants.

\$850k per year over 3 years

\$200K per year over 3 years

\$450k per year over 3 years

Expected impact

OVER 10 YEARS

- **Expedited development** of the city through shifting budget allocations amounting to \$20-50M resulting in sustainable urban development and growth
- **30 developed community neighborhoods** throughout the country
- **Significant employment and economic infrastructure** with 200 relocated companies and start-ups in the Negev and Galilee, and 30 anchor institutions
- **100 thousand pioneers** choose to build their homes in the cities of the Negev and the Galilee

Operation (2 to 3 years per city)

- With a defined economic cluster for each city OR creates **infrastructure for sustainable economic growth**
- **Launch of an Innovation Center** in the heart of the cluster's activity
- **3000 relocations**
- **2 active impact groups per city**, organized around a common issue that has a significant outcome



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
